Several proposals were received for the Research and Grants Committee to review for the March 2024 deadline.



Congratulations to Dr. Lisa Custer and her team (Dr. Hyunjae Jeon, Dr. Elizabeth Bell, Dr. Rian Landers-Ramos) from Towson University who received support for their proposal entitled

"Comprehensive assessment of chronic ankle instability across the lifespan". Dr. Custer's team will examine if there are differences between young, middle-aged, and older-aged adults with and without CAI for the measures of 1) self-reported function, 2) physical activity levels, 3) health-related quality of life, 4) clinical impairments (balance, strength, ROM), 5) talar-cartilage deformation, 6) gait kinematics and kinetics, and 7) oxidative function and blood flow of the tibialis anterior.

Congratulations to Dr. Ashley Thrasher and Dr. Shannon David from Western Carolina University and North Dakota State University, respectively, who received support for their proposal entitled "Early professional athletic trainers' perceptions of navigating difficult conversations and conflict during transition to practice". They will examine how early professional ATs manage conflict and navigate difficult conversations, how conflict and challenges in communication impact transition to practice and what training and development early professional ATs need in order to manage conflict and difficult conversations.

We look forward to having the investigators present the findings at an upcoming meeting!



All South Carolina ATs Must Apply for SC AT License

On June 19, 2023, South Carolina Governor Henry McMaster signed S.397 into law, licensing athletic trainers and moving regulatory oversight to the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (LLR). This bill also gave LLR the ability to promulgate the regulations before fully licensing athletic trainers. We anticipate the regulations going into effect on or about May 24, 2024, which will include the same fee structure for initial applications and renewals that ATs paid at DHEC.

With the move to licensure and LLR, all athletic trainers in the state of South Carolina will have to apply for a license, even if currently certified through DHEC. This application will include a \$50 initial application fee for all applications. LLR is working on the online application process so all SC athletic trainers can begin applying before the regulation approval date, with a hopeful website launch date of May 3, 2024. Any athletic trainer due to recertify after May 3, 2024 does not need to recertify through DHEC.

Once the application is available on LLR's website, we will share additional information to guide ATs through the process. We understand the process is new for all athletic trainers in the state and hope to make the transition as seamless as possible. 
