Legislative Update

Recently, with the help of the SCATA lobbyist, Copper Dome Strategies, LLC, Senator Shealy sponsored the Athletic Trainers Act in the South Carolina Senate. This bill has been introduced and numbered S.0397. The Athletic Trainers Act currently is in the subcommittee inside Medical Affairs, where it will hopefully go to vote within the coming weeks.

On January 31st, SCATA along with Copper Dome Strategies, LLC hosted a successful legislative day. While at the legislative day Senator Shealy introduced the twenty-two athletic trainers in attendance to the Senate. During this time frame, the athletic trainers in attendance focused efforts in meetings with their local senators to get them on board for S.397. Our efforts were able to get us two official co-sponsors to the bill in Senator Nikki Setzler and Senator Josh Kimbrell. Read our bill here.

The VATA Hit the Hill Day is scheduled for February 14th in Richmond, VA. The VATA currently has a bill, HB2429, going through the legislative process. This bill would allow: albuterol administration in secondary schools; possession and administration of IV saline; and injection of lidocaine for the purposes of wound closure.
